
About me:

Winnall Moors is a 64ha wetland on the Itchen Valley, containing wet grassland, hay meadows, reedbed, wet woodland and SAC chalk stream habitats. It was once farmed by the monks of Hyde Abbey and was converted to water meadows in the 1700s. Like most wetlands is has a touch of magic about it!






Site monitoring:

HIWWT is trying to encourage the return of wading birds which once bred throughout the Itchen valley, but declined and disappeared from Winnall Moors in the 2000s. The monitoring work is focusing on how rewetting some of the water meadows affects the flora of the meadows
